These sessions have reached over people from around organisations, as well as officials from various Government departments, the US Embassy and staff from the Commission for Gender Equality. 

As part of the Vital Voices small grant project, we were able to partner with several survivors to develop a survivor informed set of Guidelines for Survivor Speakers. We are so thrilled with this resource and as one survivor put it: "This uses our full voices". We trust that this resource will not only empower survivors wishing to share their stories and advocate for change, but also educate anyone wishing to engage with survivors.





SURVIVOR SUPPORT

Pearl (not her real name) is one of the survivors we assisted during hard lockdown last year. Marina continued journeying with her, and we reached a point where we realised that she needed more comprehensive help than what we were able to provide.

Pearl has since entered a restoration program with one of our Network members, in order to receive the care, support and services required for healing. Not only is she thriving, she is already reaching out to others still in situations of exploitation! She says: "My freedom all started with one person caring enough to ask me what my dreams are.
