UNODC Workshop - 19 & 20 June 2017

The <u>GloACT</u> (Global Action against Trafficking in Persons and the Smuggling of Migrants) component of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) hosted an information sharing workshop on Trafficking In Persons in Pretoria on 19 & 20 June 2017.



The workshop focused on members of the National Inter-sectoral Committee for

Trafficking In Persons (NIC:TIP) as well as representatives from the various Government Departments working against TIP, and was funded by the European Union.

The aim of the workshop was to "Streamline and Strengthen TIP Training in South Africa", and to look at what we collectively have in terms of resources as well as where the gaps are, in order to ensure effective implementation of the Prevention And Combating Of Trafficking In Persons (PACOTIP) Act 7 of 2013. All nine provinces were represented.

Thank you to Marcel, Kirsten, Rene, Corinne and Diane who presented, representing Civil Society and sharing on our TIP training initiatives in South Africa.

Human Trafficking in the Northern Cape!



(Johannesburg, Gauteng) – A team will visit the Northern Cape in August 2017 to explore and empower the province with tools and training to counter the issue of Human Trafficking.

The Northern Cape is the country's largest yet least networked province and the NC Freedom Tour will focus on 5 towns: Kimberley (7 - 9 August), Kuruman (10 - 12 August), Kathu (13 - 15 August), Upington (16, 17 August) and Kakamas (18, 19 August).

The team will travel to the Northern Cape to provide public awareness and professional training sessions on Human Trafficking. They will also meet with key stakeholders, and impart information about the Resource Line, a support tool for every community in South Africa.

The success of the Resource Line for the period August 2016 – May 2017 is reflected in the receipt of 3 665 incoming calls from all 9 provinces yielding 120 tip offs and 29 rescues.

The outcome of the project will be safer communities as well as a flow of important information into official reporting structures, that can then be transferred into reliable data and used to accurately assess the extent of the issue in the region.
