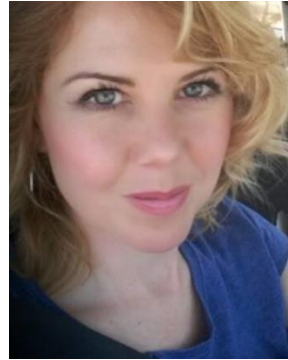


I'm watching it now and I'm emotional. Everything I researched is reflected in this short film. Well done National Freedom Network!!!!

It is clear from the short film that the whole grooming process takes place in the context of the trafficker taking time to find out what the vulnerabilities of the victim are. As human beings, we are relational creatures. The architecture of our brain is that it develops in connection with others, not in isolation. We also seek attachment from birth. Attachment is the first of the 6 core strengths for healthy development (Bruce Perry) - the traffickers know that and "move in" on that. This is depicted in this film. Therefore, we need to spend much more time on human relationships and not rely on social media and others to fill that gap in our children's lives.
