September saw the start of a 6 month project for which we received a small grant: thank you Vital Voices for believing in us and allowing us opportunity to go ahead with the project despite all the adaptations that had to happen due to COVID-19.

The project includes capacity building sessions for those working in the field; more local level coalitions; and the formulation of some exciting documents including Guidelines for Survivor Speakers (with input provided by survivors themselves) and a Safe Guarding Policy template.

We are also working on a website upgrade, fine tuning the site to be more in line with what our members need and would like.

We are excited to share the final products and further updates at the end of February!

ADVOCACY

Research & Media

There has been a lot of research conducted at various levels, as well as many media engagements, over the past six months.

NFN has also been proud to assist with the national USAID / DSI research currently underway through Khulisa Management Services; this research is looking at the Nature, Scope and Prevalence of Human Trafficking in South Africa and is the first of its kind for our country.

Civil Society Representation

Some of the Provincial Task Teams, the NICTIP and the National Rapid Response Task Team started up again from August; most welcome after a particularly silent lockdown period prior to this.

The latter part of the year also saw many online and a few in-person events, where NFN was asked to speak, contribute or represent. We are always honoured to do so.

SURVIVOR SUPPORT

Thanks to the funds raised through Freecember 2019 and a generous donation from the Mergon Foundation, we were able to support 17 survivors over the course of lockdown.

We are now on a more long term journey with 3 ladies, empowering them to reach their goals and encouraging them to become all that they aspire to.



We would also like to acknowledge NFN member EPIC Foundation who are always ready and willing to assist with comfort packs for survivors. They prepared 50 packs for men at a moment's notice, when we were alerted of an imminent rescue operation in Gauteng just before Christmas.

CAPACITY BUILDING

New monthly initiative

The first of our monthly online capacity building sessions ran on Friday 27 November 2020 and was on **Trauma Informed Care in the Treatment of Human Trafficking**. It was facilitated by Claudia Roodt from Designed to Connect, who has over 3 decades of experience in the field of Trauma.

There were 35 people in attendance representing 14 organisations, as well as 5 professional individuals. Going forward, these sessions will run the last Friday of each month, and will be open first and foremost to official NFN members and then to the wider field should spaces still be available.

Human Trafficking 101

In November Diane was privileged to co-facilitate an online session on the basics of Human Trafficking with Jacs Fourie from Small Voice. It was open to members of the Nelson Mandela Bay Justice Coalition (NMBJC) and the Tshwane Counter Trafficking Coalition (TCTC).


